
Greetings in the name of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ.

Armour Up: A Year of Strength and Faith at LCBI High School



In a world filled with uncertainty and challenge, LCBI students and staff were called to stand firm in faith, equipped with the full armour of God—truth, righteousness, peace, faith, salvation, and the Word of God. From Opening Day to final exams in June, the Armour Up theme reminded us that we are not alone in life's battles. Every chapel, every class, every game, every activity, and every conversation reinforced that we are called to live with courage, compassion, and faith in Christ.



Academically, our students engaged in new and exciting learning opportunities designed to build knowledge, confidence, and character. This past semester Grade 10 students experienced the new Financial Literacy 10 course which helped them develop the knowledge, skills and confidence to make responsible financial decisions in their futures. It is always inspiring to see how much our

students grow and gain confidence in their academic abilities during their time at LCBI, under the guidance of our amazing staff. 

At LCBI High School, the mission of Admissions and Recruitment goes far beyond brochures and tours—it's about sharing the heart of our community. Rooted in our motto, "We Would See Jesus," the admissions process is an invitation for students and families to experience more than just academics. It's a call to discover a place where faith, learning, and lasting friendships come together.



Inviting Students Into Something More

What makes LCBI stand out in today's educational landscape is the depth of the experience we offer. We are not just promoting strong academics or a beautiful campus—we are inviting students to become part of a Christ-centered community that sees and nurtures the whole person.

Recruitment at LCBI is deeply relational. Whether through open houses, school visits, phone calls, or social media outreach, our approach is personal and intentional. Every student is seen as an individual with gifts and potential, and we aim to walk alongside them as they discern their next steps.

Spend-A-Day: Experiencing Life at LCBI

One of the most impactful recruitment tools we offer is our Spend-A-Day program. When prospective students come to LCBI and experience a full school day—from chapel and classes to dorm life and extracurriculars—they begin to envision themselves here. Again and again, we hear the same words: "This feels like home."

These visits give students a chance to ask questions, connect with current students, and see firsthand the supportive and vibrant culture that defines LCBI.

This year we hosted three Spend-A-Days and an Open House. We had 62 prospective students join us for Spend-A-Days and 44 join us for Open House. Our current students do such an incredible job of hosting the prospective students, making them feel welcomed and right at home.





A Growing Reach

In the past year, we've expanded our recruitment efforts all across Canada, the United States and worldwide. With the help of our passionate students, alumni, and church partners, we are reaching more families who are seeking a school that prioritizes both academic growth and spiritual formation.

Last July we took a recruiting trip to Texas to participate in a National Youth Gathering. We have been actively going to Kinasao Bible Camp and Ranger Lake Bible Camp for the last few summers and have been a part of many Christian Youth Gatherings in Saskatchewan and Alberta. Our recruitment team is actively spreading the word about LCBI to more youth and their families.

Social media platforms such as Instagram, TikTok, and Facebook have also become essential in telling the LCBI story. Through student-led videos, campus highlights, and event recaps, we are giving prospective families a window into the heart of our school.



LCBI Summer Camps: First Glimpses of Life on Campus

Another key part of our recruitment strategy is our LCBI Summer Camps. These three-night camp experiences give younger students a fun and faith-filled introduction to LCBI before they ever consider high school. Through sports, music, games, chapel, and dorm-style living, campers get a taste of the community that makes LCBI so special.

This year we are running a Youth Day Camp from August 5-8th for grades three to six. Our Junior Overnight Camp is FULL with 110 campers and we are so excited! That camp runs August 20-23rd, followed by our Senior Overnight Camp on August 24-27th. Many of our current students were first introduced to the school through summer camp—and often say it was during those summer days that they first felt the unique sense of belonging here.

Encouraging Growth: Increased Enrollment for 2025–2026

We are thrilled to report a significant increase in enrollment for the 2025-2026 school year-a strong indicator that the message of LCBI is resonating with families across the province and beyond. With new students joining us from across Saskatchewan, Alberta, Ontario, British Columbia, Quebec, United States, Mexico, Brazil, Hong Kong, Nigeria, and Uganda, our classrooms and dorms are filling with fresh energy, curiosity, and faith. This growth reflects not only the hard work of our Admissions and Recruitment team but also the power of personal invitation, ambassadors, and the testimony of alumni and church partners who believe in the life-changing experience LCBI offers.

As we prepare to welcome one of our largest incoming classes in recent years, we give thanks for the opportunity to expand our community and continue sharing God's love through education.




Armour Up: Our Theme of the Year
